TECHNICAL REPORT

In this workshop we had three instructors, who were: Erminda Cespedes (Toy department), Mirtha Silva (Crochet), and Leyla Ladines (Paint on wood).

This document presents the development of a mixed workshop.

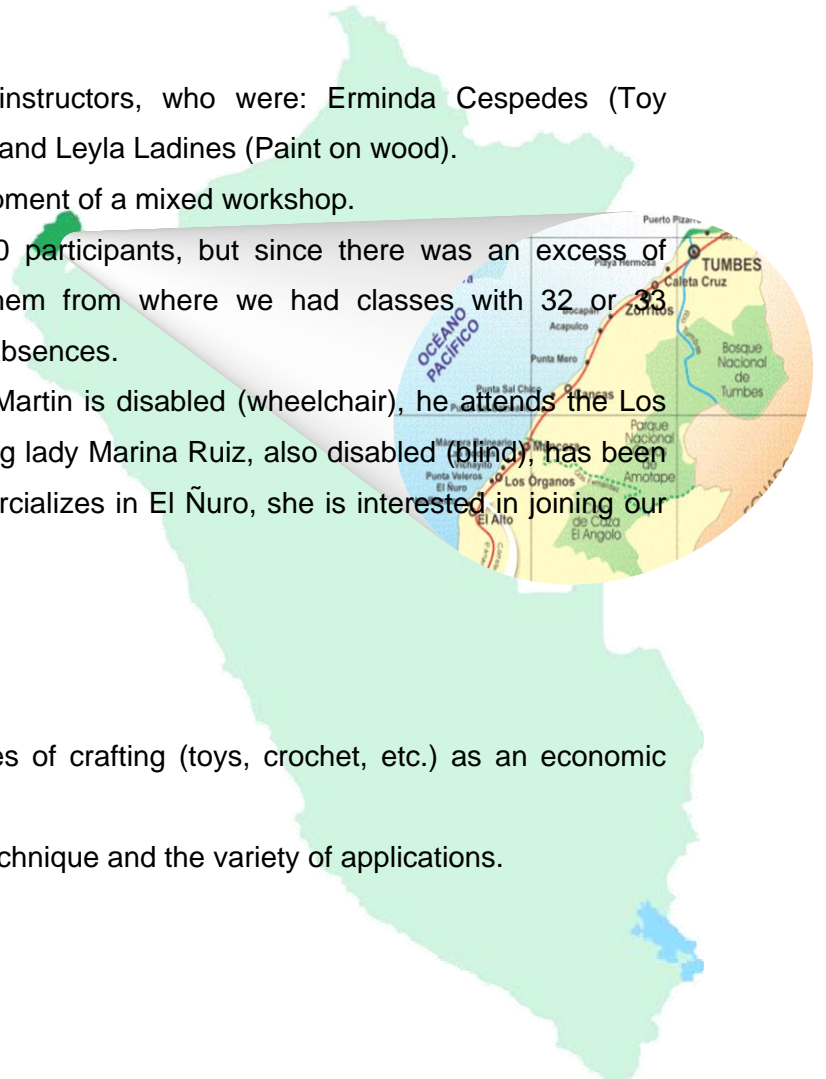
The budget was made only for 30 participants, but since there was an excess of participants we accepted 35 of them from where we had classes with 32 or 33 participants per class due to some absences.

We must point out that the young Martin is disabled (wheelchair), he attends the Los Órganos public high school. A young lady Marina Ruiz, also disabled (blind), has been making products which she commercializes in El Ñuro, she is interested in joining our association.

OBJECTIVES

Recognize and learn the techniques of crafting (toys, crochet, etc.) as an economic alternative.

Learn to manage the crochet, the technique and the variety of applications.



- Awaken the interest and make use of the remainders (scales) of fish, in order to create art emblematic to the region.
- Develop the participants' psychomotor at realizing everything by hand, as proposed by our instructors.
- Lift self-esteem by inculcating each participant that one can develop different techniques without major problems, and its subsequent commercialization.

TARGETS

- Liven up the idea of an extra income for the family.
- Incorporate into our association the most talented.
- Increase self-esteem in the disabled, their recognition and respect in the public through their art.
- Create a tourist conscience and prepare for tourist growth in the zone, with the formation of micro-enterprises.

ECONOMIC REPORT

We, the Asociación de Artesanos y Manufactureros Los Órganos (ASAMLO), report the corresponding expenses to the development of the second workshop "Handcrafts". As it was exposed in the project, there were two amounts, the honorarium to the educators (S/.800.00 soles) and the cost of materials (S/.1, 000.00 soles).

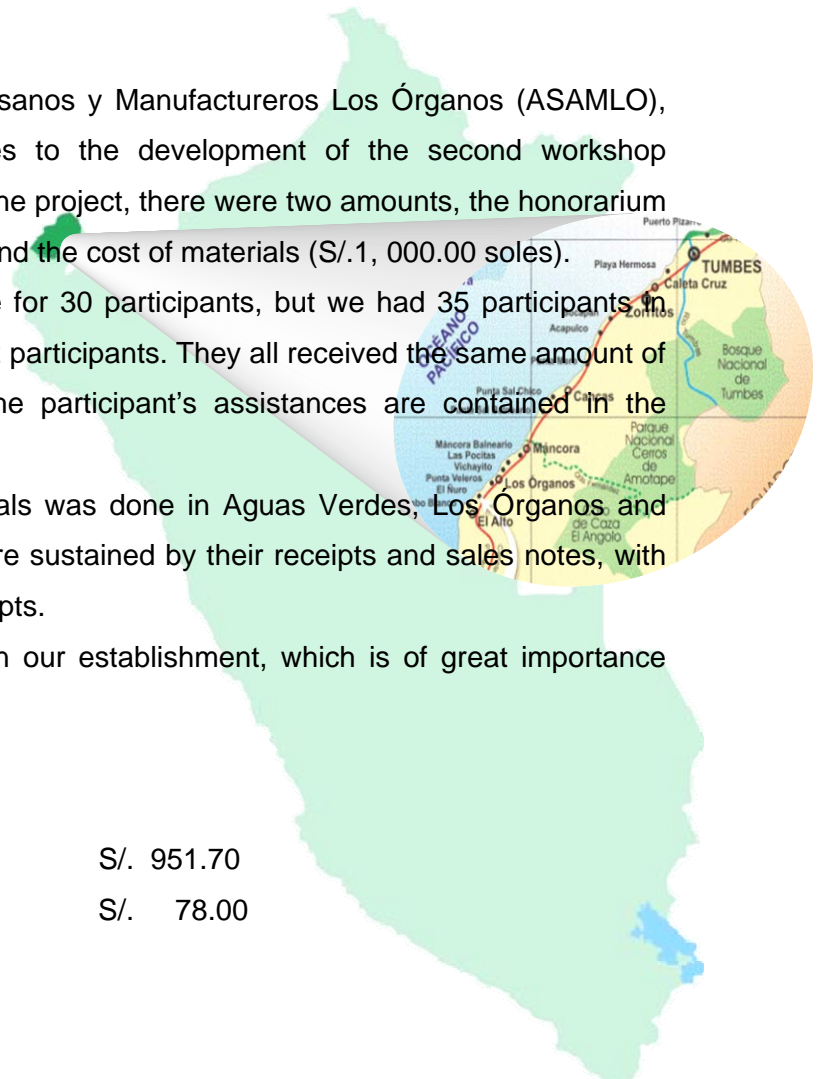
The calculations made were for 30 participants, but we had 35 participants in the beginning and we ended with 32 participants. They all received the same amount of materials for each assignment. The participant's assistances are contained in the annexes of this report.

The purchase of the materials was done in Aguas Verdes, Los Órganos and Lima. The prices of the materials are sustained by their receipts and sales notes, with the exception of transportation receipts.

A toilet was also installed in our establishment, which is of great importance relating to health issues.

The One Hundred Eighteen Nuevo soles with 30/00 (S/. 118.30) was delivered al the Treasurer of the Association for the expenses of the new free project for young people “Discovering Talents”. Now the project started in July with our own resources.

As the workshop was developed by three instructors, the amount assigned as honoraries was divided in three similar parts, depending on time taught.

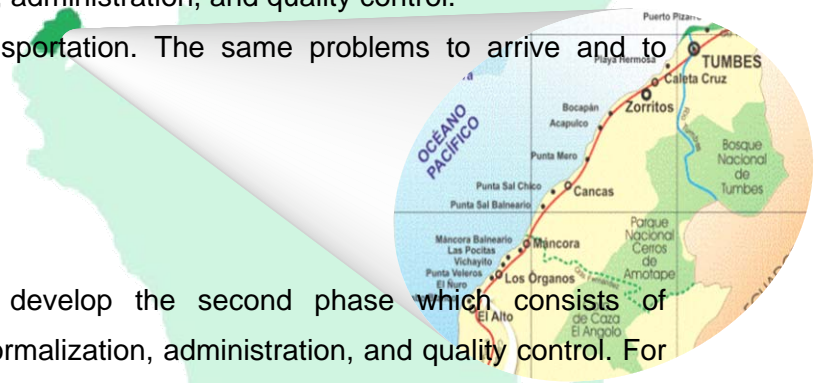
CONCLUSIONS

- In this workshop there has been the presence of young people, both students and non-students, from schools in El Alto and Los Órganos. Also, women from the Mother’s club and 2 disabled young adults.
- The participants are already making products to sell and they also have the option to bring them in to our establishment for exhibition.
- With the development of this workshop, we have been assisting a total of 102 people, reason for which, in August we should start to dictate workshops related to self-esteem, formalization, administration, and quality control.
- There is still a limited transportation. The same problems to arrive and to depart.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- Now with greater reason develop the second phase which consists of workshops in self-esteem, formalization, administration, and quality control. For which we will send details later on.
- From the workshops mentioned, starting with the self-esteem course is fundamental and essential in order to reach all the goals in the project.
